

Academic Camp Revision

Academic Camp Revision and Sidcot School have teamed together to offer you something different in the spring to help you get ready for your exams.

Our methodology is centred around **CLIL – Content and Language Integrated learning** which gives a holistic approach.

We will help you to:

- enhance your **content** knowledge and revise key topic areas in your subjects
- understand **culture** and your role as a global citizen, your beliefs and values so you can develop a reflective knowledge base in your subject
- develop your **higher order thinking skills** (critical, logical, reflective, metacognitive and creative thinking) to set you apart
- work on your **language skills** to achieve the highest results. You need to be able to understand what the question is asking and have good writing skills to communicate the best answer
- improve your **learning skills and exam techniques** so you study more effectively
- to look after yourself and your mental health during stressful times
